



Window Hummer 3 Hummingbird Feeder (WH-3)

Droll Yankees Feeders can be disassembled for easy cleaning and part replacement.

Cleaning: *Please for the sake of the birds, keep your feeders clean!* Dirty feeders can harm the birds. Use a mild soap & water solution and a soft brush for thorough, simple cleaning. Hummingbird feeders should be **cleaned every five days**, more often in warm weather, as nectar spoils easily in the heat.

Disassemble

1. Remove the feeder from the bracket by gently lifting the feeder upward.
2. Remove the filler cap by turning the filler cap counter-clockwise.
3. The bracket may be removed from the window by gently lifting the edge of each suction cup.

Assemble

1. Fill the reservoir no higher than the perch with nectar. Overfilling will cause the nectar to spill out from the ports.
Note: A hummingbird's tongue is roughly twice the length of its beak and can reach the nectar in the bottom of the feeder.
2. Replace the filler cap by turning the filler cap clockwise onto the top of the feeder.
3. Before placing the bracket with the suction cups on a clean, dry window, rub a little oil from the side of your nose onto the suction cups.
4. Press the bracket against the window horizontally, making certain that the bracket is level and the tab, located in the center of the bracket, is pointing upward.
5. Place the feeder gently onto the bracket by inserting the tab located in the center of the bracket into the slit on the backside of the feeder.

Nectar Guard Tips (NGT) may be purchased separately and are used to prevent flying insects, if they are a problem, from accessing the nectar. Please allow the hummers to get familiar with the feeder for a week before installing the nectar guard tips as the nectar guard tips will cause some resistance.
